In a few days time the month of Rabi-ul-Awwal will once again dawn upon us. It is the month wherein the greatest birth occurred — the birth of the benefactor of mankind, Rasulullah (Sallallahu Alaihi Wasallam). It is also the month of the saddest demise of all time — the demise of Rasulullah (Sallallahu Alaihi Wasallam) who passed away on 12 Rabi-ul-Awwal. Among the many things that this month makes us reflect upon is what Rasulullah (Sallallahu Alaihi Wasallam) left behind the day he left this mortal world.

FIRMLY ROOTED

One of the greatest things that Rasulullah (Sallallahu Alaihi Wasallam) left behind was an Ummah, a nation, a community of Believers who fulfilled their responsibility of being the Ummah of Rasulullah (Sallallahu Alaihi Wasallam). They were firmly rooted in the Qur'an and Sunnah and never wavered from this path. This nation continued with the mission of Rasulullah (Sallallahu Alaihi Wasallam) and spread Islam far and wide. The Ummah of the Companions of Rasulullah (Sallallahu Alaihi Wasallam) protected and passed on the Our'an and Sunnah in their pristine purity. This was the Ummah that Rasulullah (Sallallahu Alaihi Wasallam) left behind.

ONE BODY

This *Ummah* had embedded within themselves the teachings of Rasulullah (Sallallahu Alaihi Wasallam). Thus they had implemented the lessons of love, mercy, forbearance, forgiveness, justice and compassion. This united them into one body; the Body of Believers. They fitted the description of the Hadith: "The Believers are like one body. If the eye aches, the entire body suffers. If the head pains, the entire body suffers." They could not sit contentedly while another Muslim suffered. They were thus an *Ummah*. Allah Ta'ala also describes the Ummah of the Sahaaba (R.A.) in these glowing terms: "Muhammad, the Rasul of Allah, and those with him (Sahaaba) **are hard against the Kuffaar and Merciful among themselves.** You see them bowing and prostrating, seeking the bounty from Allah and His Pleasure." (48:29)

History is witness to the excellent calibre of the Ummah that succeeded Rasulullah (Sallallahu Alaihi Wasallam) upon his demise. *That* was *then*. What is the plight of the *Ummah now*.

That is perhaps the most painful question for any Muslim to answer in this present day and age.

"RE-INTERPRETATION"

While the attempt to decimate the Ummah by the gruesome and murderous policy of "ethnic cleansing" becomes more intense, the brutal attacks on the Deen of the Ummah are also increasing. To rub salt into the wounds, these attacks are carried out by those who actually claim to be Muslim. In the name of "re-interpretation" and "re-thinking" the Imaan of unwary and weak Believers is being bled away with heretical ideologies. The Ummah has long ago been warned of the likes of these "re-interpreters." Rasulullah (Sallallahu Alaihi Wasallam) is reported to have said: "Towards the latter part of the time there will be deceivers and liars who will say to you such things (pertaining to Deen) which neither you nor your forefathers ever heard. Save yourself and beware of them. Do not let them mislead you or engulf you in fitna." (Muslim)

DIVORCE

Among the alien and absurd



ideologies that are being injected into the Ummah is the kufr "reinterpretation" of Imaan and Kufr, the crux of which is that it is not necessary to be a Muslim to go to Jannah (May Allah save us from such kufr beliefs). Interest is also being "legalised" by modernised "Muslims". The Qur'anic injunctions with regards to divorce are being openly rejected in the name of "women's rights." A host of other such heretical ideas are being fed to the unwary. As a result a large segment of the Ummah is now left with only the name of Islam due to having adopted such views.

As if this was not enough, much of the Muslim Ummah has become so engrossed in the acquisition of the perishing world and other futile activities, it does not bother them of what happens to this Ummah of Rasulullah (Sallallahu Alaihi Wasallam).

UNTIRING EFFORTS

Merely lamenting the heart-rending state of affairs will not solve anything. These aspects are only mentioned to jolt us, the Muslim Ummah, into taking notice of what is really happening. To rectify the situation requires untiring efforts by one and all to protect Islam from the attempted distortions from within and without. It is time that we curtail worldly pursuits to the extent necessary and devote ourselves to improving the quality of our own Imaan and that of the *Ummah*. It is only an extremely strong Imaan that will enable us to build a nation which has some sort of resemblance to the Sahaaba (R.A.).

May Allah Ta'ala remove the difficulties of Muslims worldwide and make us once more into a true *Ummah*.

Recently I have received several pamphlets and have heard several talks wherein Imaam Khomeini's personality and Shias generally have been attacked. Why is this propaganda going on? It only serves to further divide our already fragmented Ummah. In this manner we are serving the purpose of the West. Is Imaam Khomeini's bold stand in issuing the Fatwa against Rushdi not sufficient proof of his love for our Prophet (P.B.U.H.) and for Islam?

You have raised a question which is the burning issue of the time. As such this requires some detail. It is, however, absolutely necessary that you first cast aside any prejudice and read this answer with an honest intention to find the truth.

Firstly, you have raised the issue of unity. This is extremely important. Allah Ta'ala says: "And hold fast onto the rope of Allah together and do not become divided"(3:103). Hence to be united

and avoid any division is an injunction of the Qur'an. However, there has to be some concrete basis upon which all the people should unite. It is impossible to unite two people if they are on divergent lines just as it is impossible to unite two trains travelling in the opposite directions. Therefore, what is this basis upon which these divisions and dissentions could be avoided? The answer is in the

very *aayah* quoted above. This basis is "the rope of Allah," the Qur'an and the Sunnah. All those who hold on firmly to them will remain forever united. Those who contradict the Qur'an and Sunnah, or deviate from its teachings will become disunited from the main body of the Ummah. The responsibility for the dissention and division will lie on them, not on those who are holding on firmly to the "rope of Allah."

Having understood this, it must now be determined as to who is holding on firmly to the Qur'an and Sunnah and who is not. As a test case, let us consider one aspect the aspect of the personalities of the great Sahaba (R.A.). Allah Ta'ala declares with regard to these faithful Companions of Rasulullah (Sallallahu Alaihi Wasallam): "Allah is pleased with them and they are pleased with Him." Allah Ta'ala Himself accords the title of "Companion" to Sayyidina Abu Bakr (R.A.) in the aayah: "... when the two of them (Rasulullah [Sallallahu Alaihi Wasallam] and Abu Bakr [R.A.]) were in the cave and he (Rasulullah [Sallallahu Alaihi Wasallam]) said to his COMPANION: "Do not fear, Allah is with US." As a result it is incumbent upon all Muslims to honour and respect all the Sahaaba (R.A.). However the Shias revile and slander the Sahaaba (R.A.) in terms which are difficult to

even quote. Let alone literature of bygone times which is filled with such sacrilege, Shias locally are distributing new books which they have recently printed that contain the same balderdash. For instance, Shias right on our doorstep are distributing a book by some al-Tijaani wherein he has repeatedly slandered the Sahaaba (R.A.). He distorts a Hadith totally to slander Abu BAkr (R.A.). (refer to Al-Haadi vol 2, issue 4 for details). He writes with regards to the Sahaaba (the hand shivers even to merely relate what has been written): "What kind of Companions were these people! They were not afraid of changing the tradition of the Messenger of Allah, or even the laws of Allah, in order to reach their wicked and low objectives and to satisfy their sinister desires." Read the above qoutation once more carefully. The Sahaaba (R.A.) are being accused of changing the the laws of Allah Ta'ala and Rasulullah (Sallallahu Alaihi Wasallam), of having *wicked* and low objectives and *sinister* desires. He writes that Abu Hurayrah (R.A.) "fabricated Hadith" and that Ayesha (R.A.) had "bad manners." Much more could be quoted but it is extremely painful to even relate these slanders. Now you be the judge. Who is creating the disunity? Can Muslims ever unite with those

who write in this shocking manner? This is being distributed widely by LOCAL shias. How on earth can Muslims ever be expected to unite with such people?

As for Khomeini, let the facts speak for themselves. Let us hear it "from the horses mouth" as to what respect Khomeini had for the Prophets in general and for Rasulullah (Sallallahu Alaihi Wasallam). The following is a quotation from

a Friday Khutba delivered by Khomeini that was translated into Urdu and published by the Iranian Embassy in Multan, Pakistan. The translation of the Urdu follows hereunder. Khomeini says: "All Prophets came to establish justice on the earth. Their aim was also this that they may establish justice on earth, BUT THEY WERE NOT SUCCESSFUL. Finally the Seal of all Prophets (Rasulullah Sallallahu Alaihi Wasallam) came to reform people, to establish justice on earth and to nuture (train) people, BUT HE ALSO WAS NOT SUCCESSFUL IN HIS TIME." (Ittihad wa-yak-jihati, p.15)

Ponder over what is being said. According to Khomeini, Rasulullah (Sallallahu Alaihi Wasallam) Was unsuccessful in establishing justice on the earth, he failed in reforming

people and he was unsucessful in training people (Allah forbid!). What is your judgement about the person who claims that Rasulullah (Sallallahu Alaihi Wasallam) was **UNSUCCESSFUL** and that he **FAILED** (May Allah save us!)? Allah Ta'ala has hailed the success of Rasulullah (Sallallahu Alaihi Wasallam) in several places in the Qur'an, but Khomeini believes he **FAILED**!

Can you imagine that if all the Prophets, from the first to the last, had failed, just who was successful? (*Khomeini and his followers*???) Consider the implications of Khomeini's blasphemous statement. Since Prophets are divinely appointed, it tantamounts to saying that even Allah Ta'ala failed in sending such Prophets who would be successful.

Local Shias attempt to explain this statement (rather than denounce it) by saying that it is historically true that Rasulullah (Sallallahu Alaihi Wasallam) did not convert the entire mankind to Islam in his lifetime. Thus this is the meaning of Khomeini's statement. However, a person is only regarded as unsucessful if he fails to do what he was supposed to have done - if he fails to fulfil his duty. A student who achieved 100% in his History examination cannot be called unsucessful simply because he did not do sewing or cookery. Rasulullah (Sallallahu Alaihi Wasallam) Was never commanded at any time to convert the entire mankind to Islam in his lifetime. Rather, Allah Ta'ala had informed him regarding certain people that they will never believe (Baqarah: 6). Hence is it ever possible to attribute the word "unsucessful" to Rasulullah (Sallallahu Alaihi Wasallam) in any sense? Indeed, it is downright vulgar and disrespectful in the extreme to attribute such a word to Rasulullah (Sallallahu Alaihi Wasallam).

As for Khomeini's fatwa against Rushdi, the abovementioned statement gives it away to be a cheap political strategy in order to gain the sympathies and respect of Muslims all over the world. It worked well, but you cannot hide the truth all the time. Khomeini's statement has clarified his position with regards to just how much he respects Rasulullah (Sallallahu Alaihi Wasallam).

These are the facts of the issues you have raised. May Allah Ta'ala save us from the evil of the Kuffaar and keep us steadfast on Deen.

To deprive an heir of his As rightful share of inheritance is a grave sin Many details of a grave sin. Many details of the laws of inheritance have been mentioned in the Qur'an itself. At the end of the discussion of the laws of inheritance, Allah Ta'ala says: "Those who disobey Allah and His Rasul (Sallallahu Alaihi Wasallam) and transgress his bounds: He will enter them into the fire wherein they will dwell forever. And for them is a disgraceful punishment" (Surah 4). To ignore the laws of inheritance that have been mentioned in the Qur'an and to opt for any other law which contradicts it is an extremely serious matter. Allah Ta'ala says: "It does not behove of a Believing man and nor of a Believing woman that when Allah has decreed something in a matter, that they should have any

choice in that matter." Thus when Allah Ta'ala has decreed the laws of inheritance, a Believer will opt *only* for the law of Allah Ta'ala.

It should also be remembered that one can never get away with usurping the wealth and property of others. If it is not returned in this world, one would have to pay it back much more dearly in the Hereafter. It is therefore much wiser to settle the matter in this world —



SUMMARY OF LETTER: Respected Mufti Saheb

Whenever I notice anybody doing something against the Shariah, such as swearing, etc., I immediately begin despising the person. My nafs then says to me: "You are much better than him. Others beside you are all despicable." I humbly request Hazrath to help me remedy this situation.

REPLY:

Respected Brother

To despise a person upon observing him committing a sin is itself a serious crime (only the sin should be despised - never despise the person). At such a time one should consider his own sins. He should address himself thus: "There are numerous vices in me which I am fully aware of. How absolutely despicable I have become due to these sins! On the day of Qiyamah, I will be questioned about my own sins, not about the vices of others. Allah Ta'ala says: "You are not responsible for what I (Rasulullah Sallallahu Alaihi Wasallam) do and I am not and a very serious one too. It is NOT a trivial matter. Allah Ta'ala will question me on the day of Judgement: "If my servants committed any wrong, what right did you have to despise them?" (What will I then answer?)"

GOT A CONTACT ???

Abdullah ibn Abbas (R.A.) narrates well that help comes with patience that Rasulullah (Sallallahu Alaihi Wasallam) said: "Protect the with difficulty comes ease.
